Newman's Own Foundation's grants \$1million for nutrition

Nutrition is one of the Foundation's four global funding focus areas, with emphasis on providing fresh food access and nutrition education.

Newman's Own Foundation Australian advisor Dimity Pinto said the Foundation received a huge number of applications this year and the selection process for the organisations to share in the \$1million of grants was extremely challenging.

"The charities that were finally selected demonstrated effective and innovative approaches to the broad and often complex issues surrounding nutrition," said Mrs Pinto. "It became clear that better nutrition is an extremely important in Australia and that charities see education at the core of the issue."

The charitable projects include the provision of nutritious food for indigenous, refugee and other marginalised populations, understanding how nutrition can play a vital role in disease management and the need for nutrition education in the schoolyard and beyond.

"There are many nutritional challenges across the country, and we're pleased with the response from charitable organisations around Australia," said Robert Forrester, President and CEO of Newman's Own Foundation.

"We were very impressed with the innovative approaches being employed to improve nutritional outcomes, especially in the areas of providing nutrition education and access to nutritious foods in disadvantaged communities."

Including this year's funding, Newman's Own Foundation has given over \$20 million to Australian charities since 1983.
